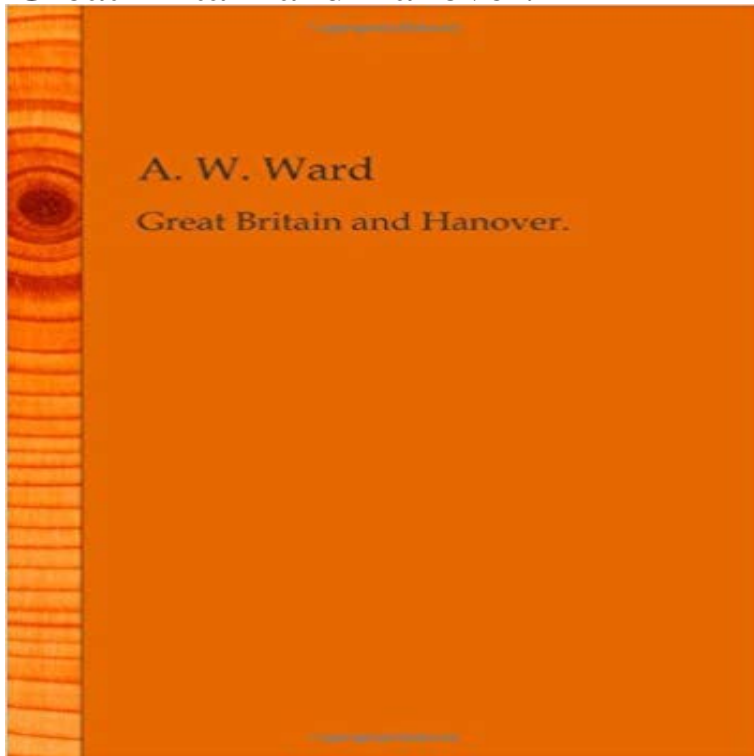


Great Britain and Hanover.
