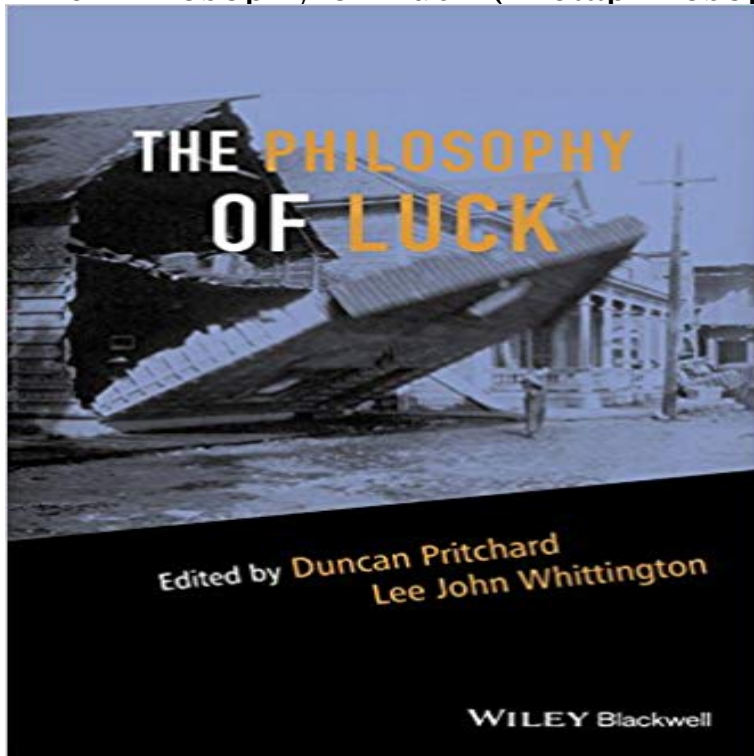


The Philosophy of Luck (Metaphilosophy)
